



Brassia & Aliceara Culture

Common Name: Sunday Best Muffin

Scientific Name: Aliceara hybrid of Brassia x Miltonia x Oncidium

Origin: Costa Rica

Temperature: Brassias like day temperatures of 65-72 °F (18-22 °C), and night temperatures of 60-65 °F (15-18 °C). Brassia intergenerics will tolerate a slightly wider range of temperatures. Keep out of draft.

Water: Water generously. Let medium approach dryness. Do not allow to dry out. Water every 3-5 days when the plant is in active growth or in a warmer household. In cooler homes water every 5-7 days.

Media: Repot every 12-24 months, as required. A coarse free-draining potting mix, predominately medium grade fir bark and coarse perlite is recommended.

Fertilization: Fertilize at 1/4 - 1/2 strength with 28-14-14 at every watering to promote new growth. When new growth matures, start fertilizing with 10-30-20 at half strength to promote flowering.

Propagation: Divide inconveniently large plants in spring by cutting the rhizome into sections, each with at least two pseudobulbs. Cut away any rotting or damaged roots, and then arrange the pieces of rhizome around the inside rim of the old pot, which has been cleaned and filled with fresh mixture. Point the new growth toward the center of the pot, and it will grow over the unoccupied surface of the mixture.

Of interest: Brassias have been nicknamed "spider orchids" because of the unusual shape of their blooms. Brassia Intergenerics are usually not as spidery but are star shaped. Brassia bloom in late spring and summer, Intergeneric blooming season is broader.

Something to think about: Brassia has 60 chromosomes compared with Oncidium species having 56 chromosomes. These species are hybridized along with Miltonia to produce the **Aliceara** hybrids. How does this affect meiosis and gamete production? Is the hybrid sterile?


We anticipate this year's show to be one of the best. More than ever, your assistance is needed to make this show a success. Please give us a few hours of your time.
