James Ph. Kotsybar is a partner in Chaotic Exotics, an orchid ranch among the vintners in the Santa Rita Hills of northern Santa Barbara County. He has served as a fully accredited orchid judge for the American Orchid Society since April 2002, and served two terms as Vice-Chairman of the Pacific South Judging Region. Six years ago, he founded the Coastal Valley Orchid Society and more recently initiated the establishment of a new judging center in Santa Barbara to better serve the northern part of the Pacific South region.



His works have been published worldwide and include The Royal Horticultural Society's **Orchid Review**, prior issues of **Orchids**, the **Orchid Digest** and **The Cymbidium Society of America Journal** as well as dozens of literary magazines and even a couple of physics websites.

April Checklist

Cattleya - The last of the winter-flowering hybrids will join the earliest of the spring hybrids in a wonderful display. Senescing sheaths need to be removed, the moisture they trap can lead to bud rot. Immediately after blooming is the best time to repot both the winter and spring blooming varieties.

Cymbidium - Adjust all staking and twist-ties as the spikes grow. Be on the lookout for aphids, slugs and snails.

Dendrobium (Australian) - These hard-cane Dendrobiums will be at their flowering peak now, provide ample water, fertilizer and light.

Lycaste - As new growth emerges provide ample water and fertilizer.

Miltoniopsis - This is the beginning of the flowering season. Do not miss the wonderful fragrance as the flowers unfold.

Paphiopedilum - This is an excellent time to work on your plants before the pressure of other potting prevents you from doing a thorough job. Be on the lookout for insect pests. Get those little guys before they get a foothold. Do not stake too soon or you will have flowers with a "nodding" stance.

Phalaenopsis - Careful monitoring of watering and feeding will give these plants the energy they require to give their best floral display. Flowers and spikes are favorite food for mealy bugs and scale so watch for these critters.

Pleurothallids - Members of this increasingly popular group will be looking their best now. The next few months provide an excellent time to divide and repot if needed.

Lloyd DeGarmo SCOS Past President 1965-66

Lloyd DeGarmo passed away on Feb. 22, 2010. He was 86. He served as an Orchid Digest Judge (no longer a judging system), a Cymbidium Society of America Judge, and an American Orchid Society Judge becoming an Emeritus Judge in the latter two judging systems which only very few judges ever attain in their lifetime! Lloyd was a retired librarian at the Compton Community College before retiring to Hawaii. An avid reader, he amassed a large orchid library which was eventually donated to the AOS. He was instrumental in editing the voluminous Proceedings of the World Orchid Conference held in Long Beach in 1966 sponsored by the Orchid Society of Southern California, introduced Cymbidium Peter Pan 'Greensleeves' when converted to a tetraploid and became a very famous breeder of miniatures and novelties. Probably his most lasting fame will be the registration of the trigeneric Oncidium alliance hybrid genus Degarmoara in 1967 combining Brassia, Odontoglossom and Miltonia. SCOS can be proud to claim him as one of our own.


