Speaker: Dan Asbell

Identifying Orchids that will Do Well in Your Microclimate

Monday, September 26, 2011

What began as his dad's hobby in the early 1960's became **Asbell Orchids** in the late 1960's. It was originally a cymbidium cut flower operation, and they did their own hybridizing. Dan grew up working and learning about orchids, but got away from the business after college. Although he always had a few orchids in a personal collection, he decided to get back into the business end of things just 8 years ago. In the meantime, the business had relocated to Arroyo Grande (near Pismo Beach). Also the cymbidium cut flower business had been replaced with potted plants obtained by hybridizing (instead of cloning). Recent and rapid major changes have occurred in the orchid business within the last decade, so they have expanded into cymbidium "companion" plants that can grow outdoors in California alongside cymbidiums. How do you know which plants are able to do this? How to recognize which plants would be good choices for your particular microclimate is the topic of the upcoming meeting. I will be using actual plants, instead of pictures, as examples and will include most of the plant table plants in my talk as well. You should be able to know what to look for and where to go to find the information that you need to be able to be sucessful growing orchids outdoors.
