Guest Speaker: **Betty P. Kelepecz**Subject: **Growing Masdevallias**Monday, February 27, 2012

Betty P. Kelepecz has been an orchid hobbyist in Southern California for over almost 30 years. She has grown orchids in Long Beach and Huntington Beach and since 2003 has been growing orchids in the Point Loma area of San Diego. She currently has 800+ orchids growing outside and in a greenhouse, including a large selection of species. Since 2005, she has become a successful Masdevallia and Dracula grower.

Betty began growing pleurothallids after she joined the San Diego County Orchid Society in 2005 and was informed by several members that her home in Point Loma was a good environment for growing her favorite but not yet successfully grown orchid, Masdevallia veitchiana. She was also encouraged to join the Society's Species Group.

As a result, Betty began growing Masdevallias outside in her side yard, under a small overhang which partially shaded the side patio area of the house. That particular location has become a perfect micro-climate for shade-loving, cool-growing orchids and Betty's Masdevallia collection has since grown to 150 almost exclusively species Masdevallias. She also grows over 30 species of Draculas and several of her Masdevallias and Draculas have been awarded American Orchid Society awards. Betty has also established a small but, quite functional orchid flasking lab in her home where she has been hobby flasking and growing predominantly species orchids for about three years.

Betty's talk will be on growing Masdevallias and will include a discussion and show and tell of the subgenera of the genus Masdevallia. She will include guidelines for successfully growing other pleurothalids, including Draculas.

### **SCOS Display Awarded at Westminster**

Members of the SCOS, along with those from other nearby societies, gathered in the Westminster Mall on the Thursday the 9th of February to set up a display for the Newport Harbor Orchid Society (NHOS) Orchid Show and Sale to be held Friday through Sunday. Per agreement to meet that morning, I drove down to the Westminster Mall. John Reyes and Janell Schuck were there, unloading plants and materials for the display. Later, Jim Hoyle and Whitney France showed up; they had been there, dropped off plants, and taken a tour of the mall. Sam Hale showed up with other tropical plants, including ferns and small palms, to be used as background. Janell brought plenty of Spanish moss, to cover pots (and protect plant tags). Butch Arciaga brought in some of his blooming orchids, and then drove home for more! But the real action started when Espie Quinn arrived (with more orchids) and started to direct the arrangement.

We were quite busy, assembling John's platform, and arranging plants, elevating some on overturned plastic pots to place flowers at a height that assures they are visible. We placed Cymbidiums on one side and Laelias on the other, with Paphiopedalums at lower levels. We distributed plants to take advantage of flower size and color. We placed Australian Dendrobiums to take advantage of large sprays of flowers, and Cattleyas to take advantage of their large and showy blooms. Jim's mounted species sat up front, where they could be seen and enjoyed. John wrote plant names on tags, and we labeled the plants to identify them to show visitors. Espie directed us in arranging everything, and we were busy for over three hours before we could relax and enjoy our handiwork. NHOS provided tables giving us a 5' x 8' display area, and we more than filled it, putting several large plants beside the table in a show of abundance.

I returned on Friday to see what awards, if any, we had won. The SCOS was awarded the Orchid Expo Society Display Award - First Place trophy! (As part of this award, John later accepted a check for \$150 for the society.) Also, the SCOS was given the Shoppers Delight Award for Best Use of Color! In addition to the two awards for the SCOS, those who entered individual plants were awarded. For example, Osmoglossum pulchellum, belonging to Jim Hoyle, was given a First Place ribbon. The award for Best Use of Color was certainly appropriate for our display. A large, perfectly flowered, white Blc. Andean Mist was the center of the display. Green, yellow, and brown Cymbidiums filled the background. We had pink Cattleya loddigesii, dark red Burr. Living Fire 'Dark Fire', orange Laelia Santa Barbara Sunset 'Showtime', and yellow Laelia Canariensis 'Golden Glow' and Dendrobium speciosum.

I walked around to look at the vendor displays, and make plans for my Spring restocking. Andy's Orchids, SBOE, Sunset Valley, Cal-Orchids, Hatfield's, LICO and others were busy setting up their wares. The society sales table was there, and John and Espie took shifts selling member plants. I regret not attending the lectures this year; they were very informative last year, and I surely would have learned something new if only I could have been there.

On Sunday, I returned to help take down the display. At 6:00 p.m. sharp, we started dismantling the display, taking plants to load into our cars. John, Janell, Sam, Espie, Butch, Jim, Whitney, and I were packed and cleaned up in about a half hour, all wrapped up until next year.


