## Pleurothallids You Might Grow Outdoors in Long Beach

Members of the SCOS were treated to a very fine discussion of growing Masdevallias and other Pleurothallids by our February speaker, Betty Kelepecz. Giving these plants a more shady exposure and plenty of water seemed to be key. Since the meeting, I have been spritzing my small Pleurothallids with distilled water every morning, where before I only spritzed on warm days. I believe I can see a difference already, in part because these plants grow faster and, without real pseudobulbs, respond faster to the amount of water they get from day to day. (Generally cooler weather may also be helping this year.) I have buds on my Masd. ignea and veitchiana that look larger and more healthy than in past years. The Masd. coccinea is putting up strong new growth, and others look equally health. Having grown these plants outdoors here in Long Beach for several years, I have had flowers from time to time, and am looking forward to more. Based on my experience, below are some plants I can say are good candidates for growing in this area.
