Integrated Pest Management for Orchids by Dr. Thomas C. Quick

Program Starts at 7:00 p.m. Monday, March 28, 2016

Dr. Thomas C. Quick is the Global Sales Manager for GROW MORE Inc. He manages sales and new product development for fertility and pesticide products for high value fruit, turf, ornamental, and vegetable crops. In addition, Tom has an active role in product registrations, with a primary focus on global Organic Products. Prior to this fertilizer business, Tom was the Vice President of the Agricultural Division of Eco Soil Systems Inc., with responsibility for Product Development, Management and Marketing of the TerraViva Bioject Programs used on farm and on golf course fermentation of beneficial microbial products and organic soil amendments in agriculture, in the USA, Mexico and Australia.
