

- #317 St. Psyche X B. Digbyana. The combination is known as a Lowiara. Colors will be mostly shades of orange, flame, yellow and allied colors. Should be some excellent breeding material here.
- #316 C. Henrietta Japhet X SI. Psyche. Sophrolaelias of the orange section have proven to be color dominant when crossed with whites. A most interesting and promising cross. Seedlings grow remarkably well.
- #312 C. Porcia, 'Canizarro' X SI. Psyche. The most famous of the bifoliate cluster Cattleyas by a red Sophrolaelia. We frankly don't feel we can predict the growth habit here. As with other Sophrolaelia crosses this parent will have say as to color.
