CULTURE OF NEOFINETIA HYBRIDS

SARCOCHILUS HYRID ORCHIDS Speaker: Charles Weckerle-Thrun

7:30 p.m.

Our January speaker will be Charles Weckerle-Thrun... whom most of we orchid hobbyists know as "Butch at Rowlands." He has been interested in Neofinetia for at least 10 years, and for 15 years has been hybridizing and has developed ten new crosses of Sarcochilus. These are cool growing orchids that are suitable for backyard growing in Southern California.

Butch has been an American Orchid Society (AOS) and a Cymbidium Society of America (CSA) Judge for 10 years. He has been the Manager of the Rowland Collection since 1986 and also owns the Lothloaren Orchids in San Diego County which specializes in Paphs.

This is a very interesting presentation for those who do not have a greenhouse and want to grow a new variety of orchid that will survive the out-of-doors growing conditions of our area. These plants will be available on our Plant **Opportunity Table this month.**

Fu-Ran – the Japanese Wind Orchid

Neofinetia falcata, a famous native orchid of Japan, was the favorite of the ruling Shogun. Today, we know it as one of the most beautiful and charming of all orchid species. A compact growing vandaceous type that flowers freely in its summer season and often more than once a year will delight you with its elegant white blooms emitting the most beautiful, sweet coconut-like perfume. Grows easily in bark or moss in pots or baskets along with cattleyas, phals. or on a windowsill in the home or office. This is one adaptable orchid! In nature, plants can be dusted with snow in winter, and monsoons in summer. Its hybrids are just as desirable, and add some color to the collection of this group.

Genus Sarcochilus (Sar - coke - eee - loose)

The genus Sarcochilus native to Australia include 15 described species that are found ranging from the far south (very cold climate) to the far north (tropical climate). In order to give any specific cultural instructions it would be necessary to know the actual species or hybrid that you are trying to flower.

Most of the Sarcochilus offered for sale are either S. hartmannii or S. fitzgeraldii. A primary hybrid between the two, S. Fitzhart is very likely the easiest of all to grow and bloom. Both species mentioned are lithophytes, very rarely epiphytes, that like moist, but not wet feet

Sarcochilus and their allied genera are extremely easy and rewarding Sarcochilus fitzgeraldii plants to grow. They are compact plants with a monopodial growth habit. They branch freely from the base and grown rapidly into dense clumps. Each mature plant, in the clump, will produce from 2 to 5 racemes with as many as 25 flowers per raceme. A mature clump, in bloom, carries flowers that almost totally obscure the foliage.



Sarcochilus are compact plants that grow to an average maximum height of 6". These plants usually bloom in spring. They are continuous growers and require no rest period. They slow down considerably in very warm weather - but they never stop.

Ribbon Judging Final Results for 2007

At the end of each year, the SCOS tallies the awards garnered by each of our members through the ribbon judging that takes place at each of our monthly meetings. This year, outstanding flowers commanded first, second, or third place ribbons, and well grown plants were awarded cultural ribbons. At our December Christmas Party, certificates were given to second through fourth place, and first place was given an elegant glass trophy, presented by and named after Past President Phil Plocher.

As many of you already know, Espie Quinn received the 2007 Phil Plocher award. Espie grows mostly outdoors, and always has several well groomed and tended plants with high quality flowers ready for each month's showing. Espie's orchids include Cymbidiums in winter, Laelias in Spring, and Paphiopedalums and Oncidiums in the Fall. At every meeting, she had at least one, and most of the time, more than one award-quality plant. As a further bonus, her displays were always elegant, framing her orchids to their best advantage.

Doris and Larry Arakaki placed second, also consistently participating, and always having one or two or more outstanding plants. In May, their Masdevallias shown like tiny jewels. At our August meeting, they displayed award winning plants in four genera: Cattleya, Vanda, Paphiopedalum, and Stanhopea.

Jim Hoyle finished third. Jim's plants tended to be species, and were often from the less represented genera. His culture was always outstanding, giving credence to his unique growing medium, a rough finished board drilled until it looks like Swiss cheese on which he mounts his many exotic plants. Jim displayed incredible Miltonias and Pleurothallids in October, scoring just enough to slip into third.

Kathy Synstelien consistently displayed at least one award winner at most meetings, and at our May meeting produced outstanding examples in four subtribes. Kathy grows many orchids; her large volume
 of plants not only keeps her busy, but also assures her of flowers throughout the year.

Our thanks to all the SCOS members who displayed their orchids in 2007, and congratulations to our winners. Now the slate is wiped clean, and we will see what the new year brings. I can safely guarantee it will include many exciting, interesting, and exemplary orchids. Come share your favorite plants with your fellow members.


