### In the Editor's Garden Cattleya forbesii

Cattleya forbesii is a bifoliate cattleya, those typically having more but smaller flowers than the larger and more showy unifoliates (e.g., C. labiata, C. warscewiczii). The bifoliates are often more colorful, with striking contrasts between lip and petals (e.g., C. bicolor) or darker purple spots on lighter backgrounds (e.g., C. leopoldii). Alas, C. forbesii has none of these compensating factors. It typically produces one or two flowers, usually of light green color, with a cream colored lip. Children of a Lesser God comes to mind.

Below are pictures of three examples growing under shadecloth outdoors near the ocean. These include a plant (first row below) acquired at least 15 years ago from SBOE that probably represents the typical or more common color form. Sepals and petals are somewhat striped, light green, and the lip cream colored with splashes of yellow and red veins.

The next plant (second row below) is a Cattleya forbesii acquired from Sea God Nursery; its clonal name is 'Clear Jade' because the sepals and petals are a more uniform color. This must be a tough plant, because it sat on my orchid bench unplanted for a year, and was only rescued when it was seriously withered; it recovered and bloomed on its first new growth. In spite of the greater uniformity of sepal and petal color, this is still the typical color variety.





Last July, while browsing around the greenhouses at Cal-Orchid, I spotted the plant below. It is also a Cattleya forbesii, but the sepals and petals are salmon pink rather than green. The lip is more pink than cream and the midlobe is clearly pink. Jim Rose commented on the unusual color form, showing it to several guests after having sold it to me. It was also unusual in having four flowers on one stem. Alas, over the winter it appears to have acquired a virus, as the new growth did not emerge until late this year, and the flowers appeared, four months later than usual, with evident color break. Still, the flowers are predominently salmon pink, and so I am tempted to keep up the search for different color varieties of this lesser Cattleya.
