The guest speaker for this month is familiar to everyone in this area, especially those who have been to the Los Angeles County Arboretum, where he is the Chief Orchidist. Mr. Hist has spent his life in the study of orchids, and is one of the local experts in this field. He also was the co-ordinator between the Arboretum and the Southland Orchid Show last March, and rendered invaluable service in getting the Show together, and making it the huge success that it was. We can anticipate an illuminating talk, which should be of special help to those just being initiated into the fascinating world of orchid raising.

Our speaker last month, was Mr. Leo Holquin, of Armacost & Royston. His talk was on Potting Media. He gave a history of the various methods which had been used over the years - osmunda, gravel culture, wood fibers, fir bark, palco wool, palco wool and chips, fir bark and redwood shavings, straight redwood shavings, hapu, etc., illustrating his remarks with sample boxes of the mixes and specimen plants (out of their pots) showing the root developments in the various media. Then Mr. Holquin showed slides again demonstrating his points. It was a very interesting and instructive talk.

We are still appreciative of the work our good friends on this committee are doing. Space does not permit our acknowledging their efforts every month, but we are none the less thankful for their untiring labors. Thanks, too, to Mrs. Charles Dixon for the unique centerpiece last month.

SOUTHLAND ORCHID SHOW


Plans are being made for the Second Annual Southland Orchid Show to be held again at the Arboretum in March 1960. The Show will be put in on the 16th, judging to
