HAVE YOU HEARD? "For the orchid grower, it is better to prevent diseases from developing in the first place. This is often possible if a grower will use good cultural practices unfavorable for the entrance of disease organisms. These include: 1. Water only when necessary. 2. Water in the morning so plants can dry off during the day.

3. When dividing plants, disinfect knives between cuts.... 4. Keep newly acquired orchids isolated from others.... 5. Disinfect the potting bench.... 6. Take precautions to keep plants free of insects. 7. Isolate plants that are known to be, or suspected of being, infected with disease." ORCHID DISEASES, State of Florida Department of Agriculture.

Well-ripened wood cuttings of Stephanotis will root readily in a closed case at 70° in a mixture of sand and peatmoss. Begonia (Fibrous) seed sown this month will bloom by Christmas.

Rod McLellan wrote an article for UNDER GLASS a magazine published by Lord & Burnham. In the article titled "Cypripediums Simplified or Reborn!", Mr. McLeelan listed the four terrestrial genera..."Paphiopedilum (Asia...most popular), Cypripedium (North Temperate Zones), Phragmipedium and Selenipedium (both of South America) belong to the Cypripedium tribe ... and all, are generally referred to a Cypripediums. The unique and appealing shape of the flower not only suggests a lady's slipper, but also gave inspiration for the tribal name. Kypris ... Cyprus, pertaining to Venus and pes, pedis, Latin for foot ... also synonymous with the Greek Aphrodite and podos; thus Cypripedium, and this in turn giving usage to the delightful term "LADY SLIPPER ORCHID."

For years, growers have been afraid to allow water in the crowns of their plants for fear of rotting them off.... The growers assumption was correct to the degree that if water remains in the crown for a long length of time, a bacterial rot can occur. However, overhead watering is not injurious if plants are watered in the morning.....therefore allowing time for natural evaporation to occur."


