HAVE YOU HEARD? What is this thing called Humidity? The term is used to describe water vapor or moisture present in the atmosphere. Humidity is not ordinarily visible. If you try to force more water vapor into the atmosphere than it will hold, then moisture will be deposited on objects and surfaces that are the same temperature or cooler than the air.

Mrs. R. Northen likes to keep the relative humidity between 40% and 60% allowing it to drop to 40% at certain periods and rise to 60% at other times.

<u>DID YOU KNOW?</u> Petal - Blight usually is confined to older, fading orchid flowers, although occasionally young, fully-opened blooms have petal-blight due to this fungus. During cold and damp weather, this disease is most common.

*There are just so many square feet of space in the greenhouse, and you will get just so many blooms whether you have 200 or 300 plants. Leave space between your pots for circulation, and keep the leaves tied up to avoid overshading other plants. -- Sweet peas, for blooms by April, sow seed in mid-December.
