PAPUA NEW GUINEA-
THE LAND THAT TIME FORGOT.

MR. REYNOLDS WILL TELL OF HIS ADVENTURES IN A STILL HIGHLY REMOTE PORTION OF THE WORLD. IT IS A PRESENTATION THAT WILL EMPHASIZE THE PEOPLE, PLACES AND PLANT LIFE OF THE TROPICAL RAINFORESTS. SLIDES WILL INCLUDE PORT MORESBY, MT. HAGEN, MT. GILUWE, The Baiyer River Sanctuary (preserving many native plant and animal species), THE JIMI VALLEY, PLUS MORE.

MR. REYNOLDS EXPLORED NEW GUINEA AS A VOLUNTEER IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE SAN DIEGO ZOO'S ORCHID COLLECTING EXPEDITION THIS PAST SUMMER. IT IS FELT BY THE ZOO AND ALAN THAT, AT THE RATE THE WORLD'S RAINFORESTS ARE DIMINISHING, IT IS IMPERATIVE THAT SUCH COLLECTORS AS THE ZOO GO INTO THESE AREAS TO SAVE MANY OF THE SPECIES THAT MIGHT OTHERWISE VANISH FROM THE FACE OF THE GLOBE. ALAN HIMSELF IS AN AVID COLLECTOR OF SPECIES ORCHIDS AND THOROUGHLY WELCOMES SUCH AN ADVENTURE.

Mr. Fang is a graduate of Alhambra High School, attended East Los Angeles Community College, Cal State-Long Beach and is now a senior at Cal Poly Pomona majoring in Ornamental Horticulture. He is also employed at Cal Poly Nursery, as a student assistant on the Raymond Burr Orchid Collection. He registered his first orchid hybrid called "Phal. Memoria Gwen LaBounty." He won the prestigious first place award in the student scientific paper presentation at the 83rd annual meeting of the American Society of Horticultural Science, held at U.C. Davis. His paper titled "Surface Disinfestation of Tissue Cultured Anthurium," is the first student from a western university to win first place in the competition, and the only student from a non-land grant university to ever receive the award. His immediate goals are to attend UC-Riverside graduate program of study under the well known plant scientist-Dr. T. Murshilage. To become an American Orchid Society Judge and to promote more scientific research on orchids. South Coast Orchid Society is fortunate indeed to have him as our First Vice-President.

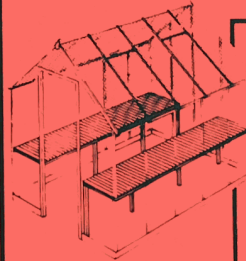

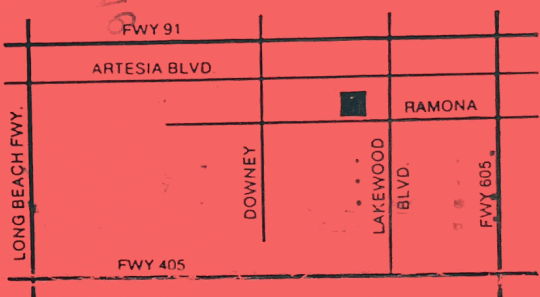
